Horticulture Supervisor Training Skill Set (TASMSS0213)

Now is the time to upskill and grow the supervisors in your workforce.

This accredited training program has been designed for employers in the Vegetable Growing, Fruit Growing and Viticulture Sectors to upskill the knowledge and skills needed to handle performance management and reporting requirements that are a core component of any supervisory role.

Participants will learn how to:

- Effectively lead a team within the new work arrangements, including minimum earnings floor, piecework rates, data recording and reporting requirements.
- Support the health and safety of workers by carrying out compliant workplace procedures.
- Lead the performance of a team and develop team cohesion.
- Comply with industry quality assurance standards in production of food and raw materials produced in agriculture.
- Coordinate worksite activities for small-scale projects

Employer Eligibility

Subsidised by the Tasmanian Government, entry to this program is via nomination by farming business employers with the following conditions:

- Employers must have a physical base and worksite in Tasmania.
- Employers must be horticultural (or viticultural) businesses.

Employer Co-contribution

This program is funded by the Tasmanian Government through the Department of State Growth. An employer co-contribution fee is payable.

- Cost for Employers with fewer than 20 current employees (FTEs) is \$210 per participant
- Cost for Employers that have more than 20 current employees (FTEs) is \$420 per participant.

Outcome

On successful completion of this course, participants will receive a Statement of Attainment for the following units:

- AHCWHS301 – Contribute to work health and safety
- BSBLDR414 - Lead team effectiveness
- AHCWRK306 - Comply with industry quality assurance
- AHCWRK305 - Coordinate worksite activities

These units may provide credit towards a Certificate III or IV in Agriculture.

Course Delivery

The program will be delivered across the three key regions of Tasmania; TasTAFE has campuses at Clarence, Burnie and Alanvale.

This course is delivered over eight weeks and consists of four workshops, online webinars and on farm training and assessment
